- 7.2 Stipend Review Committee –  
Tuesday, March 4, 2008, 3:30 HDHS

- 1.0 Review contract language on roles and responsibilities of Stipend Review Committee

Steve pointed out some conflicting language in the negotiated teachers’ contract. Specifically noted was one section that stated a teacher could request that a new position be formed (Article 2 A.2.b), and another that said the board first had to approve acceptance of a position before a recommendation was brought forth on a stipend (Article 2. B.1). Also, there are some questionable areas as to the applicability of the request to adjust a stipend for individuals not covered under this contract (for example, if a coach or an advisor is not a certified professional, does the process of reviewing a stipend apply to that individual?) (Article 1.A.B) Lastly, there is contradictory language in the contract in the articles that state that for the first year of an approved stipend position, the board will set the stipend (Article 2.B.1). This conflicts with an earlier subsection of the same article that states the Stipend Review Committee will recommend a stipend for the approved position Article 2.2.b.). It was recommended that these areas be reviewed and clarified during the negotiation process. (See sections for Stipends and for Individuals covered under the negotiated agreement)

- 2.0 Review and act on request to adjust Cross-Country Coach stipend

The letter requesting review of the Cross Country Coach for the High School was distributed and reviewed. Points noted were:

- The coach’s displeasure that his stipend was not reviewed and that it was not in alignment with other stipends is misplaced. It is the responsibility of an

individual receiving a stipend to bring forth the request in a timely manner when he or she feels there are some inequalities. The committee understands the coach's concerns and wishes that he had raised the concerns at the beginning of his season so an adjustment could have been made had it been warranted.

- The committee reviewed the points allocated for this sport and found them to be fair and just
- The committee did not support making an adjustment in the stipend that would be either retroactive (as it would open any and all other stipended positions for such review and do away with the timely process of submitting a request) or proactive for the next season (as there would be no way to project the number of participants or contests involved)
- The committee recommends that the coach for cross country review both the number of participants and the preparatory meets and actual scheduled meets for the 2008 season and, if warranted, submit a new request for review at the start of that season

**Action: There is insufficient evidence to adjust the agreed upon stipend upward for the 2007 season**

3.0 Review and act on request for new position of Jazz Choir Accompanist

The committee read the request for the approval of the new position of a Jazz Choir Accompanist. After review, the committee did not feel it lies within its role and responsibility to approve the new position. Rather, the committee feels such approval must come from the MSAD #16 Board of Directors or subcommittees thereof and that they should submit such approval to the Stipend Review Committee who will then recommend a stipend based on review of the existing point formula.

**Action: No action as approval of a new position is not the responsibility of the Stipend Review Committee. The request should be submitted by the author to the superintendent asking that the MSAD #16 Board of Directors take action on the request.**

7.3 Wellness Committee – 3/6/08

1. Healthy Maine Partnerships  
Renee gives group the 411 on Healthy Maine Partnerships Qualifying tobacco policy can yield some very nice "No Smoking" signs for our school campus. Laura will get current tobacco policy to Renee to check and see if we qualify. School Health Leadership Council: Wellness Committee will brainstorm potential coordinators. The Committee decided to make establishing a School Health Leadership Council at Hall-Dale a goal for next year and will discuss next steps at the May meeting.

2. School breakfast discussion  
Are breakfast options appealing to students?  
Do students have enough time to eat breakfast during the school days?  
Is not being able to eat breakfast in the classroom a hindrance for students?  
Dylan will take these questions (or similar ones) and create a survey on "poll daddy" to get more data on the students' needs and attitudes and will report back this data at our May meeting.

3. Physical activity  
Supervised physical activity during school day (study halls and lunch time):  
The high school provides an open gym when possible. If volunteers could be found this could take place on a regular basis and students' use would increase and become routine. Further discussion is needed about how to solicit volunteers.  
Fitness Center discussion: Wellness Committee would like to have a fitness center at the middle/high school, possibly where the stage is in the high school gym.

Wellness Committee makes a motion: The Wellness Committee recommends that the Simmons' Fund Advisory Committee dedicate funds to establish a fitness center to be used by students, faculty and the community.

4. Boosters Club  
Steve MacDougall applauds the change in the relationship between the high school and the Boosters. The Wellness Committee will draft a letter of appreciation and promise. (Laura will start the first draft.) The Committee will promise to keep the Boosters involved in our work by asking that a

representative from the Boosters be appointed to the Committee. The Committee will ask that the Boosters commit to adhere to the Wellness policy and continue their collaborative approach to working with the school administration.

Water bottles to promote hydration: Everyone liked the idea. There was some discussion of how to do it, what kind of water bottle, how much to charge (or to provide for free) and if the students would use them. Steve MacDougall will talk to a friend about availability and price of water bottles that are toxic-free (not plastic known to leach bisphenol-a, a cancer causing chemical found in Nalgene bottles.)

### Food Service

The financial status of the Food Service Account continues to be challenged by surcharges for fuel. The cost of fuel has increased the cost of food deliveries significantly. Projections to balance the accounts are still expected.

### Buildings and Grounds

Middle School bleachers have been ordered and are due for delivery and installation this year. Our insurance audit recommended a retrofit of ADA, railings, aisles, etc. that exceeded the cost of replacement.

Elementary School kiln connection and installation specifications are being investigated for proper alignment and insurance inspection.

High School Chemistry/Physics lab design modifications have been received from the architect and a bid process will occur in the near future.

End of year and summer projects include conversion to electronic heating and ventilating controls at the Middle School, canopies at the High School front entrance, generator at the High School, garage storage at the Elementary School, dugout at the High School, paving at the High School, painting fascia and trimming of trees at the High School and Central Office modifications for technology repair area.
